



Funding has been secured from the Coronation Living Heritage Fund for new Community Orchards and Mini Forests across Worcestershire.

The Scheme is open to parishes and community groups who can apply for advice, trees, guards and other materials from the County Council's Countryside Service. The scheme is very much aimed at community involvement with volunteers, Tree Wardens, schools and local groups being given the opportunity to get involved.

Community Orchards are a wonderful asset to any neighbourhood, celebrating Worcestershire's great orchard heritage as well as bringing blossom and local fruit into the heart of your community. Mini Forests are a new way of establishing native trees that originated in Japan and consists of densely planting native saplings in a small space which grow quickly and establish micro forest habitats ideally suited to urban or built up areas. Please see:
